## Graduating This Semester?



All students planning to graduate this semester should submit the online **Application for Degree** form, available at: [https://portal.santarosa.edu/SRWeb/SR\\_DegreeAudit.aspx](https://portal.santarosa.edu/SRWeb/SR_DegreeAudit.aspx). Students, who plan to graduate in spring 2015, are urged to consult a counselor with questions regarding SRJC's approved majors and degree requirements. The Admissions Office will review your coursework and determine your eligibility for graduation. All candidates will receive an email notifying them of a change of their degree status. Student may receive a letter if the graduation petition is unapproved. The Commencement invitation letters will be mailed out in mid-April. We encourage all graduates to attend the Graduation Ceremony, on May 23rd. It is a happy occasion, and a great way to conclude your studies here. We encourage you to invite family and friends to attend. Letters of Invitation for family members traveling from overseas are available by contacting International Student Program office in Plover Hall. This year's ceremony takes place at the Santa Rosa campus on Saturday, May 23 for summer 2014 and fall 2014 graduates and eligible spring 2015 degree candidates. It is held at the outdoor stage near the front of the campus, with a reception to follow in Bertolini Hall. More information on purchasing a cap and gown,

Recently we heard from a former international student, Duc Pham, who transferred from SRJC after spring 2013. He recently wrote to give us an update.



*"I am graduating from Cornell this May. I have been accepted into the graduate programs in biomedical sciences at the Mayo Clinic and Cornell. I'm thinking about coming back to Cornell because it will allow me to spend more time teaching during my graduate training. I'm also working to establish a summer research program to bring 1-2 SRJC students to my home lab at Cornell to mentor and give them substantial research experience in the biomedical sciences. I spoke with Dr. Chong in January, and he expressed his interest in the program. . . I'm also working with Cornell to get them on board, so hopefully the program can be up and running in the summer of 2016."*
