

Your F-1 visa determines what you can and cannot do during your period of authorized stay in the U.S. It is critically important that you maintain legal F-1 status so that you may be eligible for the employment opportunities outlined below. SRJC will provide you with the information you need, but it is your responsibility to obey the F-1 regulations during your studies at SRJC.

Agencies & Staff: Here are relevant agencies governing F-1 student employment:

- Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS): the database used by schools and government agencies to monitor international students in the U.S.
- Designated School Official (DSO): SRJC employees who are authorized to issue I-20s, update SEVIS, and advise international students on maintaining F-1 status.
- U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS): the government organization that processes and adjudicates Economic Hardship and OPT applications.
